PARTICIPATION AT HIDDEN VALLEY ZEN CENTER

MEMBERS may attend any event offered at the Center, including regular sittings and—on acceptance and approval of sesshin applications—sesshin. (Non-members may attend one or two sesshin on the basis of receipt and approval of a sesshin application, but pay a higher fee for sesshin. After having attended a maximum of two sesshin within a given year, membership is required if one wishes to continue attending sesshin.)

MEMBERS may also attend Sangha meetings and meetings of the Board of Directors, and vote in Sangha meetings.

FRIENDS OF THE CENTER may attend occasional sittings and sesshin. However, if a Friend of the Center is accepted to a sesshin, s/he pays the non-member price.

- MEMBERSHIP entails ongoing involvement in and regular financial support of the Center. Please see "Membership in Hidden Valley Zen Center: Privileges and Responsibilities" for a full list of the privileges and responsibilities of membership.
- * FRIENDS OF THE CENTER (minimum \$100/year donation) are those who would like to have some connection with the Center and help support it in some way, but are not particularly interested in taking part in events at the Center except rarely—for example, for ceremonies or other special events or for an occasional sitting.

Additional (financial, work, or other) donations are gratefully received at any time, as our Center operates entirely on financial offerings. We are a not-for-profit religious corporation under 501(c)(3), and so your gifts are tax deductible.

Membership at Hidden Valley Zen Center Privileges and Responsibilities

Privileges

- ❖ Sanzen [private interview] with Roshi on an ongoing basis

 There are a number of 1-day, 2-day, 4-day, and 7-day sesshin per year here. In

 addition, there is sanzen during daily morning and evening sittings outside of
 sesshin.
- Teisho [Zen talk] During sesshin and at other times when Roshi is available to give teisho, or Zen talks. (Teisho are traditionally considered expressions of the fruits of Zen.) These are open to members whenever they are offered, in or out of sesshin.
- Priority for sesshin
 If there are more applicants than spaces available for a given sesshin, members are given priority over nonmembers, all other things being equal.
- Special member rates for sesshin attendance
 Sesshin fees for members are lower than those for nonmembers.
- Discount on purchases of calligraphies.
 Members receive a 10% discount on purchases of these original calligraphies, which come with a short commentary on the meaning of that calligraphy.
- * Daily sitting opportunities with the group

 Members are free to attend the regularly scheduled formal sittings, and also to
 come and sit informally in the zendo on their own at other times outside of
 sesshin. Non-members may come for a few weeks only, after which, if one
 wishes to continue sitting at HVZC, membership is a requirement.
- Voting privileges in Sangha meetings, and eligibility to attend all meetings of the group, including meetings of the Board of Directors
- * Library privileges at the HVZC library
 Hidden Valley Zen Center has a small library of books of interest to people
 practicing Zen (and a few others, as well). Members may check these books out to
 read at home if they wish.

Responsibilities

- * To help support the Center financially....

 Electricity, water, repair and maintenance are ongoing expenses, and it is through the generosity of the members that it becomes possible to maintain both the buildings and our possibility of practicing at the Center. We also provide partial support for our teacher. These are paid for by donations.

 There is no set fee for membership. However, it is expected that each member will pledge and pay an amount of monthly or quarterly financial support that is in accordance with his or her life circumstances. Donations are welcomed and gratefully accepted at other times and on other occasions as well.
